One-day seminar on Human Rights and Educational Reforms in Balochistan

The issue of Human rights and educational reforms has got special attention in Pakistan, particularly in Balochistan. Balochistan currently is facing a lot of challenges such as access to education, escalation of the private schools fee, lack of infrastructure, gender disparity, protection of basic human rights, deficit of democracy etc. In this context, BUITEMS Law School in collaboration with The Human rights Council of Baluchistan thus organized a one day seminar on Human Rights and Educational

Reforms in Baluchistan.

The event took place on 19th of September, 2024 in City Campus Auditorium. It provided a platform for students to address these issues, propose some solutions, create awareness and foster dialogue. The panel included Ms. Farkhanda Aurangzeb (Member of Human Rights commission of Pakistan), Imran khan (General Secretary Human Rights Council of Balochistan), Dr. Asif Raz (Director School of Law) and Ms. Shahida Habib Alizai (Human Rights activist and HOD Gender studies UoB) while Ms. Shakeela Kakar (Assistant Director Student Affairs and Academics) was the organizer of the event.

The event aimed to aware the Law students regarding governmental processes and parliamentary proceedings and to engage them in discussions on critical issues affecting Balochistan, boost their confidence and communication skills. It provided students a platform where they can improve public speaking skills through discussions and debates that would eventually improve their leadership potential.

Since the purpose of the Session was to create a mock Assembly so, firstly students were assigned different roles such as members of the assembly (MPA), the Speaker, Chief Minister, opposition leader, and ministers etc. Later, an Introduction to the Mock Assembly was given by the organizers which was followed by the opening speech of the speaker and discussion on Agenda. Next debate and discussion started and the Assembly members discussed the specific cases of human rights violations, including land rights, disappearances, and freedom of expression. Access to education, the quality of infrastructure, and the gender gap in schools was also discussed and proposals to improve the education system, including government funding, curriculum reforms were given.

After that a bill was proposed and discussed so different arguments were built which were for and against the legislation. After the debate, participants voted on the proposed bills, simulating the democratic process. Lastly, participants shared their experiences and awards were given to the best delegate and the best speaker.

This event gave students an understanding of the law making, debating and bill passing, which can bridge the gap between theories that students have studied so far and their practical application. Such activities can improve the research skills and critical thinking, which will help them analyse complex legal cases and social problems. Most importantly, this activity can improve the public speaking, debating skills, which is very crucial in the field of Law.

Students of Biotechnology visited PRL Balochistan Reported by: Dr. Haleema Sadia

On September 27th, 2024, a visit to the PCR lab at the Fatima Jinnah Institute of Chest Diseases, Quetta, was organized for the students of 7th-semester, department of Biotechnology BUITEMS, Quetta. The visit, coordinated by Dr. Haleema Sadia from BUITEMS and PTP/PRL Balochistan, aimed to provide students with hands-on insight into the diagnostic procedures conducted at the hospital and expose them to the machinery used in testing. Upon arrival, the students were warmly welcomed by Mr. Rauf, a senior microbiologist and PhD candidate, who provided an introduction about himself and the lab. After a brief refreshment break, the students were



divided into three groups of seven, and masks were distributed for safety. The visit began at the reception area, where students observed the receptionist collecting samples and completing patient forms. The instructor explained the types of samples collected and different forms of TB, which the students found highly informative. After a brief Q&A session, the group entered the BSL-2 lab. Safety gear was provided before entry to protect against airborne diseases. Inside, students observed the process of culturing samples and mixing them with media and chemicals to prepare for further testing. Next, the students were introduced to the GeneXpert PCR machine used for testing samples. They observed how the results, indicating the presence or absence of TB, were generated and displayed on a computer screen. The computer operator explained the operation of the machine and the types of outputs it produced. The visit continued to the conventional PCR lab and the Line Probe Assay area, where students learned about additional testing methods. Overall, the visit was regarded as highly informative and engaging. The students gained valuable knowledge about TB testing, which will aid their future studies. It was recommended that such visits be integrated into the curriculum to enhance learning through practical exposure, and the students expressed enthusiasm for more opportunities like this in the future.

Workshops on renewable energy and seminars with industry experts were also planned. One-day capacity-building training session on international refugee protection laws

A training session was conducted by the BUITEMS Law School in collaboration with UNHCR to empower and educate students regarding the international legal framework for refugees. These laws protect refugees' rights and the responsibilities of host countries towards refugees. The event occurred in the BUITEMS Law School Auditorium on 4th October 2024. Miss Tahira Awan (Senior Protection Assistant UNHCR) and Mr. Haider Zaman (Assistant Protection Officer UNHCR) were the guest speakers, while Dr. Asif Raz was the event's chief guest. The event was organized by Ms. Shakeela Kakar (Assistant Director of



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Student Affairs and Academics). The event's main objective was to help the students understand the national and international legal frameworks governing the protection of refugees and enlighten them on Baluchistan's roles and responsibilities towards refugees under international Law. The training also aimed to create awareness regarding refugees' challenges in Balochistan, develop students' ability to advocate for refugee rights, and contribute to developing pro-refugee policy. The speaker discussed the role of Pakistan as a signatory and shed light on challenges that refugees face regularly in accessing legal rights, housing, education, healthcare, and protection from forced return and discussed the role of UNHCR in protecting their rights. Through this session, students were able to analyze case studies of real-world refugee challenges by applying legal laws, and their reasoning skills were also enhanced. Students will get connected to the UNHCR team, which will benefit them in the future in terms of internship opportunities. The session will give an understanding of national and international legal frameworks based on protecting refugees, and they will become socially conscious and aware of global and local human rights issues. Hence, it will inspire students to pursue careers in humanitarian law.

On October 9, 2024, the Board of Studies (BOS) for the Department of Civil Engineering convened at a video conference room under the chairmanship of Dr. Naik Muhammad. Members included Prof. Dr. Khan Shahzada, Prof. Abdul Jabbar Sangi (via video), Prof. Dr. Zafar Baloch, Dr. Saeedullah Jan, Dr. Syed Nasir Shah, Dr. Syed Abdul Ghafar, Dr. Muhammad Irfan (co-opted). The meeting focused on revising the curriculum to align with the Pakistan Engineering Council (PEC) 2023 Guidelines and UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Key decisions included increasing BOS meeting frequency, revising survey



forms, finalizing Final Year Design Projects (FYDP) by the 6th semester, and introducing a compulsory Quran Nazira and Translation course. Additionally, course contents were updated, and a proposal for new courses was approved. The initiation of a PhD program and the development of a workload policy were also discussed, with a commitment to implement these changes in the upcoming academic cycle.

International webinar titled "Mastering Systematic Reviews"

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On October 14th, 2024, the Department of Biotechnology at BUITEMS, Quetta, organized an International webinar titled "Mastering Systematic Reviews: A Step-by-Step Guide for Researchers." The event began with a welcome from Professor Dr. Haleema Sadia, who underscored the importance of systematic reviews in advancing evidencebased research. She emphasized how these reviews synthesize knowledge, identify research gaps, and guide future studies, offering valuable insights for researchers at all levels. Prof. Dr. Haleema Sadia, the chief organizer, was joined by co-organizer Dr. Muhammad Yaser Khan, a



PhD researcher from the University of Foggia, Italy. Dr. Mohammad Imran from BUITEMS discussed systematic review methodologies in his talk "Mastering the Art of Systematic Review: From Formulation to Publication," drawing on his expertise in AI and process mining. His presentation provided practical insights into conducting reviews in complex fields. - Each academic program will conduct a Self-Assessment Report (SAR), assessing its alignment with PREE standards, which include curriculum design, student advising, faculty qualifications, and institutional resources.

3. Programmes Undergoing Self-Assessment 2024-25

- The following departments and programs were identified to undergo the Self-Assessment process:
- BS Textile Engineering
- BS Electronic Engineering
- BS Education
- BS Public Administration
- BS Chemistry
- BS Microbiology
- BS Computer Science (University College Zhob)
- These assessments will evaluate each program against predefined criteria, including curriculum design, subject-specific facilities, and student support.

4. Steps of the Self-Assessment Process

- Director QE&A explained the nine-step process for conducting a self-assessment, from forming a Programme Team (PT) to submitting an Implementation Plan based on the assessment team's findings.
- The Institutional Quality Assessment and Effectiveness (IQAE) office will oversee the coordination and review of the Self-Assessment Reports.

5. Action Plan and Follow-up

• The outcome of the assessment will include the development of an action plan to address areas for improvement and capitalize on strengths. The Directorate of QE&A will monitor the progress of implementation.



3 GOOD HEALTH AND WELL-BEING National Consultancy Meeting: UNESCO Guidelines on Governance of Digital Media Platforms Reported by: Tarig Mehmood Khattak

United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), Balochistan University of Information Technology Engineering and Management Sciences (BUITEMS) Quetta, and Institute for Research Advocacy and Development (IRADA), jointly organized a multi-stakeholder National Consultancy Meeting on UNESCO Guidelines for the Governance of Digital Media Platforms at BUITEMS on Monday 28th October, 2024.

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Vice Chancellor BUITEMS, Prof. Dr. Khalid Hafeez in terms of UNESCO guidelines recommended self-regulatory, co-regulatory, and statutory governance



mechanisms, emphasize media information literacy and cultural diversity, and propose processes for content moderation, risk assessment, and accountability. Mr. Tariq Mehmood Assistant Professor Department of Mass Communication at BUITEMS welcomed the meeting participants from academia, civil society and digital journalists, initiating a constructive dialogue on UNESCO's Guidelines to create a conducive environment for public discourse on freedom of expression, access to online information and governance reforms in digital media platforms of Pakistan. Prof. Dr. Abdul Wadood, Dean Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities (BUITEMS) extended recommendations for a national level regulatory framework that aligns with the UNESCO Guidelines.

Mr. Hamza Khan, National Professional Officer at UNESCO called for an environment that safeguards freedom of expression, access to information, and human rights in a safe digital space. Advocate Aftab Alam, the CEO IRADA in his speech assigned roles to states, digital platforms, and other stakeholders, advocating a multistakeholder, human rights-based approach. Mr. Adnan Rehmat, media consultant at International Media Support (IMS), emphasised on a future roadmap for effective implementation of the guidelines for governance of digital / social media platforms and enabling the environment for exercise of fundamental freedoms and digital rights of citizens.



Advocate Ms. Jalila Haider, Human Rights Defender, Ms. Farkhanda Aurangzeb, Member National commission for Human Rights and Ms. Fauzia Shaheen, Chairperson Balochistan Commission on the Status of Women, during panel discussions, focused on strategies that can be used to hold social media platforms accountable for online misinformation, disinformation and particularly hate speech against women. Mr. Shireen Khan, Chairperson and all the faculty at Department of Mass Communication appreciated the cooperation between stakeholders, media literacy, call for better content moderation and curation by digital media platforms.

The consultation is the first of four, to be held in each provincial capital, followed by a national level consultation in the capital. These consultations will provide an opportunity to seek and collate recommendations from various stakeholders for the governance of digital media platforms in Pakistan with respect to internet freedom, human rights, access to information.




- Emphasizing concise, tailored CVs that showcase achievements and align with job descriptions.

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

The Government of Balochistan has developed the "Balochistan Building Control and Town Planning Rules 2022" to address this need. It is with great pride that we acknowledge the trust placed in Balochistan University of Information Technology, Engineering & Management Sciences (BUITEMS) by the Government of Balochistan.

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The government has chosen BUITEMS to spearhead a crucial initiative aimed at enhancing the resilience and stability of buildings in Quetta City.

Under the leadership of Engr. Dr. Naik Muhammad Babar (PhD, PE), this initiative exemplifies BUITEMS' commitment to ensuring the safety and integrity of buildings.

Dr. Babar serves as the Head of the Department and Associate Professor in the Department of Civil Engineering at BUITEMS, as well as the CEO of DNM Engineering Consultants. He is an active member of the "Engineering Curriculum Review and Development Committee (ECRDC)" of the Pakistan Engineering Council, the "Pakistan Green Building Code" committee of the Ministry of Climate Change, and the committee for the "Making Five-Year Plan for Pakistan 'Bridge and Roads'" of the Planning Commission of Pakistan. Notably, Dr. Babar developed the "Balochistan Building Control and Town Planning Rules 2022."



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The BUITEMS team will conduct a comprehensive examination of over 2400 buildings in Quetta City, focusing on site plans, soil tests, building materials, and structural integrity. The project will be completed within 12 months, with the following milestones:

- Data collection and documentation (3 months)
- Site visits and inspections (4 months)
- Structural assessments and testing (3 months)
- Reporting and recommendations (2 months)
